

ALWAYS DELIVERING IMPROVEMENTS ACROSS HILLMORTON

New bus shelter and road safety improvements delivered by your local Conservative team

■ A raft of improvements have been delivered across Hillmorton thanks to the hard work of your local Conservative team.

After residents complained about the lack of a bus shelter at the junction of Lower Street and School Street your councillors were quick to act, and a new shelter was installed at the end of last year.

Many residents have also complained about parking on pavements, particularly at junctions. This can restrict visibility, making the junctions unsafe. After a number of complaints

about the junction of The Kent and Waverley Road, our councillors arranged for bollards to be installed.

Further improvements include the installation of a tactile crossing on Featherbed Lane between the parade of shops and Webb Ellis Court, making crossing the road safer for elderly people, those with visual impairment, and parents with young children.
