This May saw scheduled County Council elections as well as Rugby Borough Council (RBC) elections delayed from 2020 and a by-election in Admirals and Cawston.

All your Conservative candidates won their seats. County Councillor Peter Butlin was re-elected and Dr Mark Williams and Carolyn Watson-Merret became the new Borough Councillors.

Both Carolyn and Mark are experienced councillors, Mark says "we are really grateful to both be elected and have hit the ground running in terms of getting to work. Thank you to everyone who voted for us, but we will work for everyone to make sure Admirals and Cawston continues to be a great place."

#### GREEN SPACES

Green spaces and shared outdoors areas are important to us all.

Your Councillors Mark, Dale and Carolun met with RBC officers & the Parish Council to look at a wildflower specific pockets of land owned by RBC, where grassland grazed by cattle has become greenspace surrounding homes and public walkways. Some of these areas were left deliberately to "wild up," however grazed land is nitrogen heavy and poor for Wildflower meadows. The wildflower meadows, as a project of this nature, take years to propagate and seed, watch this



space for a future rich in diversity for sharing with birds, butterflies & pollinators.

## DRONE TO CATCH FLY-TIPPERS

.....

Rugby Borough Council's Cabinet approved the purchase of a guadcopter along with training for officers. Use of the drone will allow officers to survey unsafe buildings, inspect parks and open spaces and investigate environmental crime more quickly and safely. Aerial reconnaissance will allow them to inspect previously inaccessible sites.

Deployment of the drone will comply with CAA regulations. Its use will be monitored for compliance with theData Protection Act to protect the privacy of residents. Details of how the drone will be used and how privacy will be protected will bepublished on the council's website.

## MARK PAWSEY MP -A&E SURVEY

According to the House of Commons Library 83% of people living in the Rugby constituency live more than a 15-minute drive from an A&E department.

This is due to the downgrading of the A&E department at the Hospital of St Cross in the late 1990s.

Since being elected as the town's MP in 2010, Mark has been firm that as Rugby grows, the case for the restoration of A&E at St Cross has grown too.

Mark is now asking for the support of Rugby residents to build a case for the return of A&E in Rugby. He is hoping residents will complete his online survey on healthcare and emergency care at St Cross which can be found at
